


ORDER OF SERVICE

The service begins with a procession led by the crucifix and ended by the pastor-elect.

Stand at the introduction to the opening hymn and face the crucifix at the back of the church.

THE WORD

First Lesson ----- Joshua 1:1-9

This is what happened after the death of Moses, the servant of the LORD.

The Lord said to Joshua son of Nun, the attendant of Moses, "Moses my servant is dead. So prepare to cross the Jordan River that lies in front of you. You and all this people, prepare to go into the land that I am about to give to the people of Israel. I have given you every place where the sole of your foot has stepped, just as I promised Moses. From the Wilderness and from Lebanon to the Great River, the Euphrates River—all the land of the Hittites—as far as the Mediterranean Sea, where the sun sets, this will be your territory. No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. Just as I was with Moses, I will be with you. I will not abandon you, and I will not forsake you.

"Be strong and courageous, because you will divide this land among these people, this land which I swore to their fathers that I would give to this people. Just be strong and very courageous. Be careful to act according to the entire Law which my servant Moses commanded for you. Do not turn from it to the right or to the left, so that you may succeed wherever you go. This Book of the Law must never depart from your mouth, and you are to meditate on it day and night, so that you will act faithfully according to everything written in it, because then you will prosper in everything you do, and you will succeed. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified and do not be overwhelmed, because the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

Second Lesson ------ 1 Peter 5:1-7

Therefore, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and as one who also shares in the glory that is about to be revealed, I appeal to the elders among you: Shepherd God's flock that is among you, serving as overseers, not grudgingly but willingly, as God desires, not because you are greedy for money but because you are eager to do it. Do not lord it over those entrusted to your care, but be examples for the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive an unfading crown of glory.

Likewise, young men, be submissive to those who are older. And all of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another. For "God opposes the proud, but he gives grace to the humble."

Therefore humble yourselves under God's powerful hand so that he may lift you up at the appointed time. Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you.

Gospel ----- Matthew 9:35-10:4

After the announcement of the Gospel, the congregation sings:



Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every disease and every sickness.

When he saw the crowds, he was moved with compassion for them, because they were troubled and downcast, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore pray that the Lord of the harvest will send out workers into his harvest."

Jesus called his twelve disciples to himself and gave them authority to drive out unclean spirits and to heal every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.


As for you, keep a clear head in every situation. Bear hardship. Do the work of an evangelist. Fulfill your ministry.



DENBY Charles J. Dale, 1842–1912, alt. Setting by Kevin Hildebrand



INSTALLATION OF A PASTOR

The pastor-elect presents himself before the altar.

The installing minister addresses the congregation.

M: Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ said to his Church: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Holy Scripture assures us that our risen and ascended Lord will always provide the Church with the gifts necessary to carry out this commission. The apostle Paul wrote to the Ephesians: "[Christ] ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe. It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ might be built up."

Exhortation to the Pastor-Elect

M: Dear brother in Christ, this congregation has called you to serve in the office of the holy ministry. It is good that you should hear again what God in his Holy Word impresses on his pastors concerning the sacred office.

St. Paul states that a pastor "must be above reproach, the husband of but one wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his family well and see that his children obey him with proper respect. He must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that he will not fall into disgrace and into the devil's trap."

He urged Timothy to "set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity." He further advised him: "Devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Watch your life and your doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers."

In the final chapter of his second letter to Timothy, the apostle gives additional words of encouragement: "Preach the Word. Correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. Keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist."

The ability to carry out this calling is not in us but comes alone from God, as St. Paul reminded the Corinthian Christians: "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God."

Promises by the Pastor-Elect

M: In keeping with the Word and will of the Lord, you are about to be installed as mission planting pastor of Christ Our Savior Evangelical Lutheran Church. I ask you in the presence of God and this congregation:

Are you fully determined to carry out this work according to the grace which God will give?

R: I am.

M: Do you believe that the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments are the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?

R: I do.

M: Do you accept the three Ecumenical Creeds—the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian—as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?

R: I do.

M: Do you believe that the Unaltered Augsburg Confession is a true exposition of the Word of God and a correct presentation of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and that the other confessions in the Book of Concord are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith: the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, and the Formula of Concord?

R: I do.

M: Do you solemnly promise that all your teaching and your administration of the sacraments will conform to the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions?

R: I do.

M: Will you give faithful witness to Christ in the world that God's love may be known in all that you do and say?

R: I will, and I ask God to help me.

M: Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

Exhortation to the Congregation

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ, you have heard the solemn promise given by the one you have called to be your pastor. I urge you, therefore, to receive him as you pastor and to keep in mind always what the Word of God expects of you as members of his flock:

Listen eagerly to the preaching of the Word, receiving it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the Word of God.

Take to heart his scriptural words of warning and encouragement, humbly accepting the Word planted in you.

Work together with him for our Lord's kingdom so that by your works of service the body of Christ might be built up.

Help him by your word and example in teaching the young, remembering how the Scriptures urge you to bring up your children in the training and instruction of the Lord.

Honor and love him, as the apostle Paul says, "Respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work."

Pray for him continually, that his ministry among you may be greatly blessed and that, with all his responsibilities, he may continue to have a cheerful spirit.

Provide also for his physical needs, for the Lord says, "The worker deserves his wages," and the apostle Paul says, "Anyone who receives instruction in the Word must share all good things with his instructor."

Finally, remember what the Scriptures say, "Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you."

Promises by the Congregation

M: I now ask you in the presence of God:

Are you willing to receive your pastor as a minister of God? Will you show him the love, honor, and obedience in the Lord, which you owe to a shepherd and overseer placed over you by the Lord Jesus Christ, the chief Shepherd and overseer of souls? If so, answer: We will, and we ask God to help us.

C: We will, and we ask God to help us.

M: The almighty and merciful God strengthen and assist you always.

Installation

The pastor-elect kneels.

The installing minister, laying his right hand on the head of the pastor-elect, says:

M: Philip Schroeder, I install you as mission planting pastor of Christ Our Savior Evangelical Lutheran Church in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

May the Lord pour out on you his Holy Spirit for the work committed to you, that you may faithfully proclaim the gospel in Word and sacraments.

Those assisting may, in turn, lay their right hands on the head of the pastor and speak an appropriate Bible passage.

The pastor stands.

Prayer

M: Let us pray.

Merciful God and Father, you have graciously promised that through the preaching of the crucified Christ, those who believe in him will be saved. By your Holy Spirit grant grace to your servant whom you have given to be pastor of this congregation. Grant him readiness and steadfastness in this ministry, patience, understanding, and great zeal. Support and strengthen him in your service, that by your Word your Church may be built and increased, through your Son, our great High Priest, Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

Lord's Prayer

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever.

Amen.

M: Go, then, take up the work to which you have been called.

The Lord bless you and make you a blessing to many, that you may bear fruit and that your fruit may remain to eternal life.

Justification

¹ Our churches teach that people cannot be justified before God by their own strength, merits, or works. ² People are freely justified for Christ's sake, through faith, when they believe that they are received into favor and that their sins are forgiven for Christ's sake. By His death, Christ made satisfaction for our sins. ³ God counts this faith for righteousness in His sight (Romans 3 and 4 [3:21–26; 4:5]).

The Ministry

¹ So that we may obtain this faith, the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted. ² Through the Word and Sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given [John 20:22]. He works faith, when and where it pleases God [John 3:8], in those who hear the good news that God justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake. ³ This happens not through our own merits, but for Christ's sake.

⁴ Our churches condemn the Anabaptists and others who think that through their own preparations and works the Holy Spirit comes to them without the external Word.

Philip Daniel Schroeder was born to
Reverend Daniel Schroeder and his wife
Linka on October 4, 1994, in Milwaukee,
WI. He became a child of God in baptism
on October 9, 1994, at St. Paul's Lutheran
Church in Franklin, WI, where his father
had served as a vicar. He attended Lutheran
elementary school at Morning Star,
Jackson, WI, and Reformation Lutheran
School in San Diego, CA. He received his



confirmation instruction at Risen Savior Lutheran Church in Chula Vista, CA, where his father served as pastor. Philip received his training for the pastoral ministry at Luther Preparatory School (2009-2013), Martin Luther College (2013-2017), and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary (2017-2021). He served his vicar year at St. Martin's Lutheran Church in Watertown, SD. In May 2021, Philip was assigned as a dormitory supervisor in Summit Hall at Martin Luther College (2021-2023), a Bible History instructor, and a coach. In May 2023, Philip was assigned to be the first full-time pastor at a new mission, Christ Our Savior, in Collinsville, Ill. This new mission has an active core group of 25 souls. Christ Our Savior has served as a preaching station of Martin Luther, St. Louis, Mo., since 2002. Collinsville is in the Metro East suburban area of St. Louis. The Metro East is a well-populated area of about 300,000 people. Christ Our Savior is the only WELS church in Southern Illinois.

On June 17, 2017, Philip married his wife Sarah (née Hackbarth and 2017 MLC graduate). They were blessed with sons, Solomon, in May 2020 and Isaiah, in August 2022. Philip has four younger siblings: Kylah, wife of pastor Ethan Schultz, who is serving this coming year as a Tutor at Luther Preparatory School; Joshua, who is finishing his service as a vicar at Grace Lutheran Church, Falls Church, VA, married to Sydney (née Cody); Annika, a senior at Minnesota State University, Mankato, serving in the Minnesota Air National Guard, and is married to Sam Boeder, a recently assigned Vicar to Sure Foundation, Queens, New York; and Levi, an incoming freshman at Luther Preparatory School. Philip's parents recently moved to Palm Coast, Florida, where his father currently serves as pastor at Christ the King Lutheran Church.
