M: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.







THE WORD

First Lesson ----- Isaiah 63:16b-17; 64:1-8

You, the LORD, are our Father.

Our Redeemer from everlasting is your name. Why do you cause us to wander from your ways,

LORD?

Why do you harden our heart so that we do not fear you?

Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes that are your heritage. ...

Oh, that you would rip open the heavens and come down.

Mountains then would quake because of your presence.

As fire ignites stubble and as fire makes water boil, make your name known to your adversaries.

You did amazing things that we did not expect.

You came down. Mountains quaked because of your presence.

"No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Watch! Be alert and pray, because you do not know when the time will come. It is like a

man going away on a journey. When he left his home, he put his servants in charge and assigned what each one was to do. He also commanded the doorkeeper to keep watch. Therefore keep watch, because you do not know when the owner of the house is coming: whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or early in the morning. If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to everyone: Keep watch!"

Nicene Creed

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

M: Lift up your hearts.




M: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:






Words of Institution

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

DISTRIBUTION


