

THE WORD

First Lesson ----- Joshua 24:1,2a,14-18

Then Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, and he summoned the elders of Israel, its heads, its judges, and its officers, and they presented themselves before God.

Then Joshua told all the people, "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel has said." \dots

Joshua said, "Now, therefore, fear the LORD and serve him wholeheartedly and faithfully. Remove the gods that your fathers served in the region across the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. But if you see no benefit in serving the LORD, then choose for yourselves today whomever you will serve—whether the gods that your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amor-

ites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household—we will serve the LORD!"

The people responded by saying, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD in order to serve other gods! For the LORD our God, he is the one who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, where we were slaves. He is the one who performed these great signs right before our eyes and protected us on the whole journey that we made and among all the peoples through whom we passed. The LORD drove out of our presence all the peoples and the Amorites who were living in the land. We too will serve the LORD, because he is our God!"

Second Lesson ----- Ephesians 5:21-31


...and by submitting to one another in reverence for Christ.

Wives, submit to your own husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife, just as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he himself is the Savior. Moreover, as the church submits to Christ, so also wives are to submit to their husbands in everything.

Husbands, love your wives, in the same way as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, by cleaning her with the washing of water in connection with the Word. He

did this so that he could present her to himself as a glorious church, having no stain or wrinkle or any such thing, but so that she would be holy and blameless. In the same way, husbands have an obligation to love their own wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. To be sure, no one has ever hated his own body, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body, of his flesh and of his bones. "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will be one flesh."



Gospel ----- John 6:60-69

After the announcement of the Gospel, the congregation sings:



When they heard it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching! Who can listen to it?"

But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, asked them, "Does this cause you to stumble in your faith? What if you would see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? The Spirit is the one who gives life. The flesh does not help at all. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. But there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the beginning those who would

not believe and the one who would betray him. He said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me, unless it is given to him by my Father."

After this, many of his disciples turned back and were not walking with him anymore. So Jesus asked the Twelve, "You do not want to leave too, do you?"

Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom will we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."







M: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:






Words of Institution

M: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

DISTRIBUTION

In Holy Communion we believe that Jesus gives us his own body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of our sins. Hymn ----- Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice


- Dear Christians, one and all, rejoice, With exultation springing,


This final word I leave you."
