

SERVICE OF WORD AND SACRAMENT

CONFESSION OF SINS

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.




M: Merciful God, maker and preserver of life, uphold us by your power and keep us in your tender care:

THE WORD

First Lesson ----- Exodus 20:1-17

Then God spoke all these words:

I am the LORD your God, who brought you out from the land of Egypt, where you were slaves.

You shall have no other gods beside me. You shall not make any carved image for yourself or a

likeness of anything in heaven above, or on the earth below, or in the waters under the earth. Do not bow down to them or be subservient to them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God. I follow up on the guilt of the fathers with their children, their grandchildren, and their great-grandchildren, if they also hate me. But I show mercy to thou-

sands who love me and keep my commandments.

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not permit anyone who misuses his name to escape unpunished.

Remember the Sabbath day by setting it apart as holy. Six days you are to serve and do all your regular work, but the seventh day shall be a sabbath rest to the LORD your God. Do not do any regular work, neither you, nor your sons or daughters, nor your male or female servants, nor your cattle, nor the alien who is residing inside your gates, for in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and everything that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. In this way the LORD blessed the seventh day and made it holy.

Honor your father and your mother so that you may spend many days on the land that the LORD your God is giving to you.

You shall not commit murder.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, his male servant, his female servant, his ox, his donkey, or anything else that belongs to your neighbor.

Second Lesson ----- Romans 6:3-11

Or do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him by this baptism into his death, so that just as he was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too would also walk in a new life.

For if we have been united with him in the likeness of his death, we will certainly also be united with him in the likeness of his resurrection.


We know that our old self was crucified with him, to make our sinful body powerless, so that we would not continue to serve sin. For the person who has died has been declared free from sin. And since we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that since Christ has been raised from the dead, he will never die again. Death no longer has control over him. For the death he died, he died to sin once and for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God. In the same way also consider yourselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

M: Alleluia. Forgive each other if anyone has a complaint against anyone else. Forgive, just as Christ forgave you. Alleluia.

Gospel ----- Matthew 5:20-26


Indeed I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and experts in the law, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

You have heard that it was said to people long ago, "You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be subject to judgment." But I tell you that everyone who is angry with his brother without a cause will be subject to judgment, and whoever says to his brother, "Raca," will have to answer to the Sanhedrin. But whoever says, "You fool!" will be in danger of hell fire.

So if you are about to offer your gift at the altar, and there you remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother. Then come and offer your gift.

If someone accuses you, reach an agreement with him quickly, while you are with him on the way. Otherwise your accuser may bring you to the judge, and the judge may hand you over to the officer, and you will be thrown into prison. Amen I tell you: You will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

Nicene Creed

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

came fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayer of the Church

The minister calls for the petitions and the congregation prays with "Lord, have mercy."

- M: In peace, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, have mercy.
- M: For the people of God and for all people, lifting up our hands and prayers to our refuge and our rock, who is not deaf to His own, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, have mercy.
- M: For all the baptized, purchased from the power of sin, death and the devil, that they may count themselves as dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus, serving their neighbors in love and looking for the resurrection that is theirs as children of God, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**
- M: For all Christians, that God would increase in them true fear, love and trust in His saving name; and that we may have no other gods but Him, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

- M: For all fathers and mothers, pastors and teachers, that God would guide and bless them as they bring up children in the discipline and knowledge of the true faith, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**
- M: For Donald Trump, our president; Michael Kehoe, our governor; our legislatures and judges; our local leaders; and all who serve in our armed forces, that God would grant peace graciously in our time, since there is no other who fights for us but the Lord, let us pray to the Lord; **Lord, have mercy.**
- M: For all who are baptized into the name of our Triune God, that we would ever be mindful of how we have been united with Christ, sharing in His death and resurrection, so that we would daily die to sin and live in God's gracious salvation through His Son, let us pray to the Lord: Lord, have mercy.
- M: For all who receive the Lord's body and blood this day, that forgiven of their sins and bound to God in His communion of love, they would also gladly forgive the sins of their brothers and let no division arise at this holy table, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**
- M: For Christian people as they ponder all truth, goodness and beauty, that they would learn the truth of God's Word, be filled with virtue and right-eousness, and be inspired to adore the glory of the Lord, and so always be one with Him, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**
- M: Lord God, heavenly Father, we confess that we are poor, miserable sinners with no good in us. Our hearts and our flesh and blood are so corrupted by sin that we are never without sinful desires in this life. Therefore, we implore You, forgive us our sins. Let Your Holy Spirit so cleanse our hearts that we would love Your Word, abide by it and, by Your grace, be saved forever; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the same Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

M: Lift up your hearts




M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


Words of Institution

M: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

DISTRIBUTION

In Holy Communion we believe that Jesus gives us his own body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of our sins. We ask that, in keeping with God's Word, only confirmed members who are in confessional unity with our church (WELS and ELS) would come forward to receive this sacrament.
